Facts

Anyone can be sexually abused, sexually assaulted or raped regardless of age, gender, ethnicity, background or lifestyle.

Most perpetrators of rape and sexual assault are known to the victim.

Most abuse takes place indoors in the person's own home or the abuser's home.

Rape and sexual abuse are crimes of power and violence.

The survivor is never to blame for the abuse. The abuser is always the one to blame for the abuse.

What is FRASAC?

How to make a referral

Referrals can be made by phoning our office on 01592 642336. Ideally we would like you to contact us yourself if you would like an appointment.

However we realise that you may need support in taking this step and might wish someone to contact us on your behalf.

We aim to provide an assessment within 14 days of referral, however if you have experienced a recent assault we will try to meet with you as soon as possible.

For partners and family members we offer shorter term support.
